The 6th Annual Autumn Classic Basic Skills competition sponsored by Blade & Edge FSC, Omaha, NE will be held at Motto McLean Ice Arena on November 13, 2011.

ELIGIBILITY RULES FOR PARTICIPANTS

The competition is open to ALL skaters who are current eligible (ER 1.00) members of either the Basic Skills program and/or are full members of U.S. Figure Skating. To be eligible, skaters must have submitted a membership application or be a member in good standing. Members of other organizations are eligible to compete but must be registered with the host Basic Skills program/club or any other Basic Skills program/club.

Eligibility will be based on skill level as of closing date of entries. All SNOWPLOW SAM and BASIC SKILLS SKATERS THROUGH BASIC 8 must skate at highest level passed and NO official U.S. Figure Skating tests may have been passed including MIF or individual dances. Skaters in other events may skate at highest level passed OR one level higher BUT not both levels in the same event during the same competition.

ENTRIES AND FEES -The first event is \$30.00 for Snowplow Sam or Basic 8 Events – first event, \$45.00 for FS 1-6 thru Preliminary & Adults for first event and each additional event is \$25.00.

Secure on-line entries may be made at www.BladeandEdgeFSC.com (follow competition links). Electronic entries paid with a successful credit card transaction will be considered a valid entry. There will be a \$25.00 fee for any credit card entry that is disputed to cover the cost of the dispute. Must be completed by 11:59pm, **November 1, 2011**.

Paper entries must be postmarked by **November 1, 2011** (Metered postage is not accepted as proof of postmark). An additional \$5.00 fee will be charged for paper entries. There will be a \$25.00 fee for returned checks. Make checks payable to Blade & Edge FSC.

Any Paper Entries postmarked later than November 1, 2011 or on-line entries after 11:59 pm November 1, 2011 will be considered a late entry. Entries postmarked after that date will be accepted at the discretion of the Competition Committee and only if accompanied by a \$25.00 late fee. The Competition Committee reserves the right to limit entries in any event or to cancel an event based upon time restrictions. Full refunds minus \$10.00 processing fee for on-line entries are available, if withdrawn prior to **November 1, 2011**. After November 5, 2011, entry fees are only refundable if the competition is not held, per rulebook. Changes in events prior to **November 1, 2011** will have a \$10.00 fee assessed. After **November 1, 2011** a \$25.00 fee will be assessed, so be sure to mark the correct events. Skater & Coach schedule will be posted on www.BladeandEdgeFSC.com (follow links).

AWARDS – Everyone will receive an award. All events will be final rounds. Medals will be awarded to first, second, and third places. ALL other places will receive ribbons. ALL awards will be made at appropriate times throughout the competition.

SCHEDULE OF EVENTS - Will be posted on the Official Blade & Edge web site and at Motto McLean and Sidner Ice Rink no later than November 7, 2011. Information regarding groups and skating times will emailed to skaters and coaches.

PRACTICE ICE - Practice ice will be available on Sunday, November 13, 2011 prior to the competition. A fee of \$10.00 must be included with the entry.

MUSIC - The music for all free skating programs and artistic must be provided on CDs by the skater. CDs should be clearly marked with the name of the skater, event entered and length of music (not skating time). Competition music is to be turned in at the time of registration in a jewel case or a sleeve. Time duration is always \pm 10 seconds.

PHOTOGRAPHS – There will not be a professional photographer at this event. Photographs can be taken of all individual skaters and award pictures on the podium by parents with their own cameras.

Format: The skating order of the required elements is optional. The elements are not restricted as to the number of times the element is executed or length of glides, number of revolutions, etc. unless otherwise specified. Vocal music is allowed.

- To be skated on full ice
- The skater may use elements from a previous level
- A .2 deduction will be taken for each element performed from a higher level
- Time: 1:00 +/-10 seconds

Connecting moves and steps should be demonstrated throughout the program. Vocal music is allowed.

- To be skated on full ice.
- The skater must demonstrate the required elements and may use but is not required to use any additional elements from previous levels.
- A .2 deduction will be taken for each element performed from a higher level.
- Time: 1:30+/-10 sec

- To be skated on ½ ice;
- No music allowed
- The skater must demonstrate the required elements and may use any additional elements from previous levels.
- A .2 deduction will be taken for each element performed from a higher level
- Time: 1:15 or less
- *Skaters may have option to skate one level higher in compulsories than their free skate program*

Test Track Program Event

Skaters may enter EITHER test track free skate program or the well-balanced track free skate program but **NOT** both during the same nonqualifying competition. Competitors will skate to music of their choice, vocal music allowed. The 6.0 judging system will be used for all Test Track events.

Deductions WILL be made for skaters including technical elements not permitted in the event description.

- 0.1 from EACH mark for each technical element included that is not permitted in the event description.
- 0.2 from the technical mark for each extra or lacking element.
- 0.1 for any spin with less than required revolutions.

SPIN EVENTS

Test and age requirements are the same as those for Free Skate (singles). Entrants may compete at one level higher than their test level, but may not skate down. Spins will be skated without music and without stopping between spins. Spins must be skated exactly as stated, but may be performed in any order and only once. Repetition of failed spins will be penalized. Only those transitions affecting entrance and exit of spins will be judged. Maximum time 1:00. All levels will be skated on 1/2 ice.

Spins are 4 revolutions unless otherwise stated; revolutions are counted once the skater is in position.

JUMP EVENTS

Test and age requirements are the same as those for Free Skate (singles). **Jumps should be performed exactly as stated and only once.** Only those transitions affecting the entrance and exit of the jump will be judged. Repetition of failed jumps will be penalized. Required single jump maybe repeated in combination jumps, no more than twice. No music will be played for this event. Event will be skated on 1/2 ice. Maximum time is 1:00.

ARTISTIC EVENTS

Test and age requirements are the same as those for Free Skate (singles). Skaters will select their own theme and music (with or without words). Artistic expression and musical interpretation are the major elements being judged. Appropriate costumes are encouraged but not required. Props may be used if they can be placed and removed by the skater in 30 seconds, and do not present a danger to the skater. All props must be inanimate objects. NOTE: PROPS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED ON PRACTICE ICE. **All times are maximums; there are no minimum times.**

OPEN PAIRS EVENT

This is a fun event open to any team who wants to present a pair program of 1.5 to 2.0 minutes. There is no restrictions as to gender, age or skating level. The music selection can be any style, with or without words. No overhead lifts are permitted. The judges will be looking for good unison and original choreography. Skate to music of your choice.

INTERPRETIVE EVENTS

Test qualifications same as for Free skate. Music Duration: Free Skate, Limited Beginner & No Test 1:15 and Pre-Preliminary – Preliminary 1:30. The performance will be judged on artistic expression and musical interpretation. Coaches are not allowed for this event. Competitors will communicate only with event officials until the skater has completed their performance.
