# 28th Annual Omaha Winter Festival Invitational February 25-27, 2010

## RULES AND ELIGIBILITY (except Basic Skills)

The 29th Annual Omaha Winter Festival Invitational will be conducted according to the current Official US Figure Skating Rulebook (2010) and is open to all eligible members of US Figure Skating according to Section 3055-3056. Competition level is the highest FREESKATE test passed as of January 11, 2010 unless otherwise stated in this announcement. Beginner, Pre-Preliminary, Preliminary, and Pre-Juvenile will be grouped according to age and without regard to gender. Juvenile and above will be grouped as set forth in the current *Official US Figure Skating Rulebook*. Entrants may skate one level above that for which they have tested, but may not skate down in any event. All age-restricted events are determined by the skater's age as of January 11, 2010. A minimum of two entries in an event will constitute a competition, otherwise the event will be cancelled, or if time permits the skater may be given the option to be critiqued.

This competition will use the **IJS** for Juvenile through Senior singles freeskate, short program and pairs events. The 6.0 scoring system will be used for Open Juvenile and below singles freeskate and all other events. Juvenile through Senior skaters entered in singles freeskate, short program and pairs events must submit the USFS online **Program Content Form by February 15, 2010**. The Program Content Form must be submitted online via the Members Only online Event Registration section.

This competition is scheduled to begin Thursday afternoon, February 25, 2010. If entry numbers warrant, practice ice may start Wednesday evening, February 24, 2010.

## ENTRIES

Entries must be postmarked no later than Saturday, **JANUARY 11, 2010**. **Entries postmarked on or before December 21, 2009 are eligible to receive a \$25 early bird discount.** Entries, to be considered timely received, must include the entry fee and all required signatures. Late entries (postmarked AFTER January 11, 2010) may be accepted at the discretion of the Local Organizing Committee (LOC) and only if accompanied by a \$25 late fee. The LOC reserves the right to limit entries in any event or to cancel an event based upon time restrictions. Full refunds will be given if a skater withdraws before the close of entries. There will be no refunds for any reason (including inclement weather) after the close of entries, except as provided by Rule 3235. In the event of illness, entry fees will be refunded only when documented by physician and when competition officials are notified before the skater's event. **Please include a self addressed stamped envelope or e-mail address to receive your event and practice schedules. CHECK YOUR ENTRY CAREFULLY WITH YOUR COACH BEFORE MAILING. A \$15 FEE WILL BE CHARGED FOR EVERY CHANGE MADE AFTER THE ENTRY DEADLINE. Please note that your "early bird" discount will be forfeited should you request a change be made after the "early bird" deadline of December 21. Changes made after February 1 may not appear in the program.

Each Skater must submit an entry form. For pairs, both entry forms must be submitted together in the same envelope. Returned check fee is \$25. There is no charge for spectators.

## FACILITIES

The Omaha Winter Festival will be held on a single ice surface at Motto McLean Arena, 5015 S. 45th St. (45th & 'P' St.), Omaha, NE. The ice surface is 85' by 200' with rounded corners. Bleacher seating for 500 is available as well as limited seating in the concession area. Concessions are offered daily. Two dressing rooms are available. Parking is adequate for 200 vehicles.

## **REGISTRATION**

The Registration Desk, in the Lobby area, will be open for check-in beginning Thursday morning 45 minutes prior to the first official practice ice and 45 minutes prior to the first event of each day thereafter. Please register promptly when entering the ice arena and be prepared to provide a telephone number where you can be reached in case of schedule changes outside the normal 45-minute pre-competition arrival period. Competitors are requested to check-in with the Ice Monitor in the arena lobby, at least 45-minutes prior to the scheduled time of their event.

## **MUSIC**

Only CDs will be accepted (**CD-R not CD-RW**). **Cassettes will NOT be accepted.** CD's must be clearly marked with the skater's name, event and running time. Each CD must have only one (1) track on it. If a competition CD is not clean and in a hard-sided jewel case or CD sleeve the CD will not be accepted by registration personnel. Competition CDs must be checked in at time of registration and will not be returned until the event has been skated. Back-up CDs should be readily available at all event times and for practice. Competition CDs may be picked up at the registration desk following each event. The Omaha Winter Festival LOC will not be responsible for any CDs left behind.

## **PHOTOGRAPHY AND VIDEO**

Official competition photographers will be available to take individual and group award photographs as well as to videotape events and take action shots of skaters during their events. Photographs and video DVDs may be purchased at their tables. Hand-held video equipment is only permitted in the bleacher area and should be used to record only your skater. **NO VIDEO EQUIPMENT MAY BE PLUGGED INTO THE ARENA OUTLETS.** Flash photography is **NOT** allowed during competition events or warm-ups. The official photographer has instituted a "**NO PERSONAL CAMERAS**" policy. No personal photos of skaters may be taken against the awards backdrop.

## **PRACTICE ICE**

THERE IS NO SEPARATE PRACTICE ICE FORM IN THIS PACKET. One (1 only) Official Practice may be requested on the Entry Form in this packet. Cost is \$12 for 30 minutes per skater. Payment must be received before Practice Ice will be scheduled.

Official practice ice will be assigned starting on February 25, 2010. Every entrant who pays for Official Practice Ice is guaranteed that it will be scheduled before their Freeski event (if not registered for a freeski event, then before their first event). **SIGN-UP FOR OFFICIAL PRACTICE ON THE ENTRY FORM, INCLUDE THE PROPER AMOUNT WITH YOUR REGISTRATION FEES, AND LET US KNOW YOUR ESTIMATED TIME OF ARRIVAL.** Every effort will be made to accommodate your arrival time. No refunds will be made for official practice ice that is not used (except in cases where skater withdraws from the competition for reasons outlined in the entries section above.)

If time allows, limited additional practice ice may be available for purchase when you arrive at the competition arena. You may also call or email **Toni Lundak, 402-384-8358, [btlundak@cox.net](mailto:btlundak@cox.net)** with your pre-competition request for additional practice ice. Additional practice sessions will also be available during Winter Festival week at other Omaha rinks; addresses and maps may be picked up at the Registration Desk at Motto McLean.

Music is guaranteed to be played on the skater's official practice ice provided that the skater checks in with the ice monitor and turns in their music prior to the beginning of the session. Additional music will be played on a first come first serve basis as time permits.

## **AWARDS**

The top three skaters in each division will receive medals. Ribbons will be awarded to fourth, fifth and sixth places. Medal awards and ribbons will be presented off ice at the photographer's desk after each event. A Team trophy will be awarded to the Club earning the most points. Points are awarded as follows: 6 points for 1st Place decreasing to 1 point for 6th Place. Hosting clubs are excluded from the team trophy competition.

## **EVENT SCHEDULE**

Official Practice Ice will begin on THURSDAY, February 25, 2010. (See "Practice Ice" section on Entry Form.) Official events will begin the afternoon of THURSDAY, 25, 2010. The official competition schedule will be posted at the rink and mailed to participants who include a self-addressed, stamped envelope or via e-mail address. 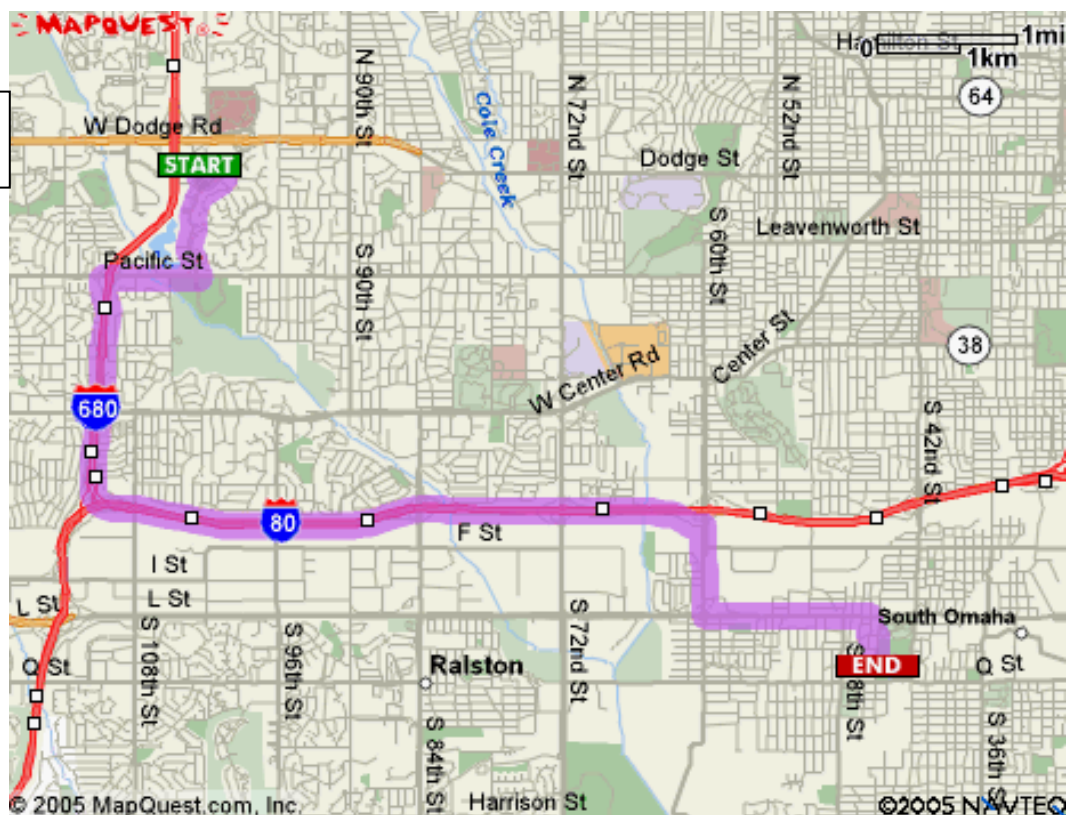

## COMPETITION EVENTS

1. Requirements for Free Skate program shall be those set forth in the 2010 Official USFS Rulebook for the **2009-2010 competition season**.
2. For each event, competitors may enter only one level. Event eligibility is based on test status as of January 11, 2010.
3. Competitors may skate up one test level unless otherwise noted.
4. Freeski and Short Program will be skated as separate events.
5. All skaters entering Beginner events MUST be currently registered in a Basic Skills program or full members of US Figure Skating.
6. Freeski Programs will be skated on full ice with music. For singles and pairs short program and free skate, vocal music with lyrics is permitted for Beginner through Intermediate levels and for all events using the 6.0 system of judging. Program times are +/- 10 seconds.
7. **Freeski Levels 1-6 will be skated as Beginner events (see below). If a skater competes at a non-qualifying competition in a "Beginner or No Test" category, then that skater must compete at the equivalent level or higher in any future US Figure Skating approved competitions and may no longer compete in Basic Skills Freeski 1-6.**

1. Pre-Preliminary to Pre-Juvenile groups will be according to test level and age.		
2. Skaters may skate up one level above their current test level.		
3. All free skate events will be skated on full ice.		
4. An axel is a single jump.		
5. There will be no axels, double jumps, or flying spins at Limited Pre-Preliminary levels.		
6. No final rounds will be held in this event.		
7. Competitors will skate to music of their choice. Vocal music is allowed for FS events up to and including the intermediate level and for all events using the 6.0 scoring system.

## Competitive Test Track Free Skate Events

1. Skaters may enter EITHER the test track frees skate program or the well-balanced free skate program but NOT both during the same non qualifying competition.
2. Competitors will skate to music of their choice. Vocal music is allowed.
3. 6.0 Judging system will be used.
4. Deductions WILL be made for skaters including technical elements not permitted in the event description. 0.1 from EACH mark for each technical element included that is not permitted in the event description; 0.2 from the technical mark for each extr

## Compulsory Moves (no music)

1. Test requirements are the same as in Free Skating. Groupings will be according to test level and age.
2. Moves must be skated exactly as stated without stopping, but may be skated in any order.
3. An axel is considered a single jump.
4. The times listed are maximums; less time may be used.
5. Additional or repeated elements and excessive footwork will be penalized.
6. Combination jumps may not have a change of foot or turn between the jumps. Required individual jumps cannot be repeated as part of the combination.
6. All events will be judged using the 6.0 scoring system.
